HOME FOCUS: GUARDIANS OF ANCORA HOLIDAY CLUB 2017

Holiday Club is here again! It is our annual whole church home mission week and we are all on the team whether baking a cake, praying, coming for the week or sending children. We really appreciate the time and energy that is given by everyone.

The programme this year looks at God's plan to save his people. It reveals that God had a plan in sending Jesus to earth - to restore humanity to relationship with him. It builds, day on day, helping the children see how the plan was worked out and how God, through Jesus, won the ultimate victory. It gives children the option to consider their own relationship with God and how this might impact their lives. Children are invited to consider the stories they hear about Jesus as treasure - stories that are of immense value and importance. As they seek the treasure of these stories, they will be encouraged to seek and find their own place in God's big, ongoing, forever story.

Long ago, Ancora's Hall of Memory was full of stories. They were told in front of the Spire of Light and powered the bright light that shone over the city. But these stories were lost - stolen by those who didn't want anyone to hear them. The Guildmaster started to recruit Guardians to find and protect these stories, and make the Spire shine once more.
