## MISSION FOCUS: JESS AND OHSUNG KWON - AMAZON

In July Ohsung and I took a trip back to Amazonas, to the same area we served for 10 years. We were able to visit the church plant we helped facilitate in

an isolated Ticuna village in the rainforest. We have been sponsoring Joni, who is Ticuna, through Bible college in Rio de Janeiro. He was ordained last month and will be the new pastor of the church plant. We were encouraged that the villagers were so positive about having a church in their village for the first time.

We are now back in Hertfordshire where we will start our second year of studies at All Nations Christian College.
