- We pray for fruit as the word of God is preached, that by the work of the Spirit, it may change us and make us more like the Lord Jesus.
- We pray for our brothers and sisters who lack food and clean water, dwell in areas of conflict or suffer
 persecution for the sake of the gospel. We pray for provision for them and for the certainty of the promises of
 God to be a comfort and strength to them. We ask God to show us where and how we can help.

Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us

- We say with David, "Have mercy on me, O God; according to your unfailing love; according to your great compassion blot out my transgressions." Psalm 51:1
- We pray that we may be those who, in recognising the costly gift of forgiveness we have received, will
